MOBILITY PROGRAMMES

There are four kinds of mobility programmes in USM:



Exchange Programme

A credit transfer programme where students study in USM for one or two semesters. Required courses enrollment are from 9 to 21 credit units.



Research Attachment

Research attachment programmes can be performed at one of our cutting-edge laboratories or facilities at USM to enhance research skills and in-depth understanding of research areas. The programme will be supervised by an expert in the field at our Schools/Centres and is more suitable for postgraduates undergoing research studies in their home countries.



Internship/IAESTE

Internship programmes can be done under research, working at any USM departments or attached to our collaborating industries. It is more suitable for undergraduates. Internships as short-term programmes are also available, such as the ITS-USM Nusatenggara Internship Programme (NUSA) or even virtual internships.



Short-Term & Summer Programmes

The short-term programme is tailor-made to cater the needs of our partner universities for mobility events in a short period of time. Under this programme, IMCC can plan a credit transfer programme or non-credit programme as necessary.



WHO ARE LIAISON OFFICERS?

Liaison Officer

Person-in-Charge (PiC) of internationalisation matters in the School/Centre/Institute

Responsibilities

- Circulate information from IMCC (e.g. international programmes, events, scholarships, etc.)
- Collect data on internationalisation activities (e.g. programmes, projects,
 visits, MOAs, MOUs, joint research projects, collaborations, joint seminars, etc.)
 and update the ICNIS system or provide the data upon request
- Work closely with IMCC for **inbound and outbound mobility** of students (e.g. placement of inbound students or selection of outbound students, etc.)
- Network engagement (e.g., create connections through EAIE and APAIE suggestions, maintain connections with current collaborators, and renew expired MOUs/MOAs etc.)



QUALITIES OF LIAISON OFFICERS

Liaison officers are essential for internationalisation in USM and Malaysia, putting the country and its education system on a global stage, and giving rise to future leaders ready to take on the world.



High Intercultural Competency

Liaison officers should be open to and respectful of people of different cultures, races, and religions



Patient


Liaison officers should be prepared to handle students who might be defensive, agitated, or facing a language barrier

ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

- Only for international postgraduate students
- Held once a year (at the end of the year)
- Involves a briefing about common procedures and relevant information, a campus tour, and others
- Liaison officers will be informed of the orientation date by IMCC



OUR STRONG NETWORKS APAIE & EAIE

In order to connect with other universities around the world, IMCC attends the annual Asia-Pacific Association for International Education (APAIE) and European Association for International Education (EAIE) conferences to make and maintain relationships with prospective and current partner universities.



If a school would like to collaborate with another university, the periodical surveys and questionnaires sent by IMCC can be filled up with details of the academic, lab, or university they would like to connect with. IMCC will then use this information to approach the university representatives at these conferences to make the partnership a reality.
